New features and enhancements

Swagger 2.0 support

API registration now supports Swagger 2.0 imports.

Cloud API connector – Salesforce.com

API Manager has been enriched with *Cloud API connectors*. These connectors allow you to easily and quickly browse and register business object APIs available in Cloud applications.

This release of API Manager supports importing and managing cloud APIs directly from Salesforce.com. It allows you to browse business objects such as leads, opportunities, and contacts and make them available to internal or external developers.

Upgrade from previous versions

API Manager now supports upgrades from versions 7.2.x and 7.3.x to 7.4.1.

This includes upgrading users from an embedded user store to a Cassandra-based user store, and upgrading all Client Application Registry data.

Fixed problems

| 767590 | 145236 | <p>Issue: Previously, when WebServices registered in Policy Studio had non-default policy container names, API Manager failed to properly generate the Swagger feed for these services (omitting the <code>basePath</code> field) which would cause the rendering of the Catalog in API Manager to fail.</p> <p>Resolution: Now, policy containers for WebServices are correctly resolved, thus resulting in a properly generated Swagger feed, and a fully rendered Catalog in API Manager.</p> |
| 777998 | 149081 | <p>Issue: Previously, API Manager did not properly resolve SOAP operations for imported WSDLs assuming that the <code>wsdl:operation</code> and the SOAP operation names are the same, but they are not necessarily. For example, this caused a <code>Request Method Not Found</code> error when using the Try It functionality.</p> <p>Resolution: Now, API Manager correctly resolves SOAP operations for imported WSDLs.</p> |
| 773124 | 146994 | <p>Issue: Previously, the API Methods page did not resize correctly cutting off the bottom of the page.</p> <p>Resolution: Now, the API Methods page expands vertically to allow you to see all the method details and no longer cuts off the bottom of the page.</p> |

Known issues

The following are known issues in this version of API Manager.

- You cannot sort APIs by organization in API Manager.
- Before configuring OAuth in API Manager, you must first set up the OAuth Token Store in Policy Studio (under **Server Settings > API Manager > OAuth Token Stores**).
- After editing an authentication profile that uses two-way SSL, the previously uploaded P12 file looks unset. The file is set, but the UI might say otherwise.
- Retired APIs status is not clear in API Catalog.
- After overriding outbound method settings in a front-end API, the **Try It** functionality no longer shows a transaction link.

- When a back-end API URL value contains a selector, trusted certificates fail to be automatically imported, and require a manual import step.
- API Manager does not support using a selector as the value for back-end API URL.
- API Manager does not handle back-end API method parameters containing hyphens (-) in the name, resulting in invalid selectors at runtime.
- **Try It** functionality does not work in recent versions of Firefox out of the box. This is because Firefox binds a certificate to a specific `<host>:<port>`. In Firefox, you must add each `<host>:<port>` certificate to the certificate manager to successfully connect to those endpoints using API Manager **Try It** functionality.
- When creating a back-end API from a Swagger 2.0 definition, API Manager does not support the following elements and will not import them into the API Catalog:
 - "title"
 - "termsOfService"
 - "contact"
 - "license"
 - "tags"
 - "securityDefinitions"
 - "externalDocs"

For each path/API method:

- "tags"
- "security"

For each parameter:

- "format"

For each response code:

- "schema"
- "headers"
